Testimony of Baptism

First – God's redemptive work on the cross through His Son Jesus Christ – Romans 5:6-11.

- 1. Vs. 6-7 Christ died for a world who rejected God.
- 2. Vs. 8 God gave His most prize possession, His Son, to a world of sinners.
- 3. Vs. 9-11 Jesus shed blood on the cross justifies sinners and saves them from God's eternal judgement.

Second – It is the testimony of a transformed sinner being saved by the blood of Jesus Christ – Romans 6:1-14

- 1. Vs. 1-2 Our baptism testifies to the death of our sinful nature.
 - A. Is. 53:6 We are like wandering sheep.
 - B. Rom. 3:23 We are all sinners.
 - C. Eph. 2:2 We are children of disobedience.
 - 1) Following the prince and the power of the air (influence of society)
 - 2) Our desire is to pursue fleshly lust (Eph. 2:3)
 - D. Eph. 2:4 "But God"

Ephesians 2:4-5 (KJV)

⁴ But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us, ⁵ Even when we were dead in sins, hath quickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;)

Four Specific Step That Take Place Before Baptism.

- 1. God's Word has been shared.
- 2. There is a response to God's Word.

Romans 10:17 (NKJV)

¹⁷ So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

- 3. There is a transformation process taking place.
- 4. A person acts upon faith.

Testimony of Baptism

- 2. Vs. 3-4 It is our symbol of New Life.
- 3. Vs. 5-14 The bondage of sin has been broken.
- 4. We are living a resurrected life (vs. 5-6).
- 5. We are no longer dominated by the life of sin (vs. 9).
- 6. We are learning to yield our life to Christ and not to sin (vs. 12-14).
