The Promise of Salvation Shining Through the Darkness of Sin Genesis 3:14-15

- 1. Genesis 3:14-15 is that moment in the Bible we see God's plan for redemption of man.
 - A. Right after humanity has fallen.
 - B. It seems that everything had fallen apart, God reveals His rescue plan.
 - C. God clearly revealing, evil will not have the last word.

Three Clear Doctrinal Truths

The seed of Woman.

- 1. The avenue for our eternal Savior to come into our world.
 - A. This passage highlights the woman's offspring.
 - 1) A direct connection with the virgin birth.
 - B. Matthew 1:18-25

For he had made him to be sin for us, who no know sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him 2 Cor. 5:21

The battle foretold.

- 1. The serpent (Satan) will strike the heel of the promise child.
 - A. This is a real wound.
 - 1) Philippians 2:6-8

The victory was secured

- 1. This child will crush the serpent's head.
- 2. Satan and his demons begin to celebrate when Jesus was taken down from that cross.
 - A. In 3 days, that celebration abruptly ended.
- 3. Christ resurrection is the triumph that turned the curse of the cross into a blessing.

1 Corinthians 15:3-4 (KJV)

³ For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; ⁴ And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:

Genesis 3:15

- 1. Reminds us that our world is still filled with injustice and brokenness.
 - A. That's not the end of the story.
- 2. The birth of Jesus Christ declares that evil days are numbered.

Conclusion

- 1. It is like watching a chess match.
 - A. The serpent makes a move that looks devastating, the cross.
 - B. But hidden in that move, God says, checkmate.
- 2. This act of bruising Christ's heel becomes the moment when Christ crushes the serpent's head.
 - A. What looked like defeat was the victory.
